Curriculum

Students choose a thesis or non-thesis option for completing a multidisciplinary survey of health and exercise science, involving opportunities for experiential learning and collaborative research. Offered courses include:

Tuition and Financing

Tuition and fees are set annually. The per-unit graduate tuition rate for the 2019-2020 academic year is \$1,528 plus applicable fees.

A limited number of full/part-time graduate assistantships are awarded to students in the program on a competitive basis. Graduate Assistants are granted full-tuition remission plus a stipend and work 20 hours per week.

Graduate students who are U.S. citizens or eligible non-citizens may apply for federal student loans. Please contact our Office of Financial Aid for more information about financing options.

REQUIREMENTS

The admission process involves a holistic review of each applicant's background and experiences. The following are required for admission through our application in GradCAS (gradcas.liaisoncas.com):

- Bachelor's Degree At least 2.65 GPA
- Official transcripts
- Resume
- Personal statement
- Three letters of recommendation

For international students, the Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL) or International English Language Testing System (IELTS) is required.
